

# CALL FOR THE BEST PUBLISHED PHD ARTICLE IN THE FIELD OF PUBLIC HEALTH

The Foundation Swiss School of Public Health (SSPH+) is promoting knowledge, skills and competencies in the field of public health<sup>1</sup>. As a part of its effort to strengthen the PhD education in Switzerland, the SSPH+ is awarding the best published PhD article in the field of public health sciences.

#### **Beneficiaries:**

PhD students who are registered in the <u>SSPH+ Inter-university Graduate Campus</u>

# **Requirements:**

- The PhD student is first author of the article which is part of his/her PhD thesis
- The article is of relevance for public health
- The article (written in English) is published in (or accepted by) a peer-reviewed journal
- The date of publication (or acceptance) is between March 1, 2019 and February 29, 2020
- Only one article per PhD student will be accepted

The PhD student submits an electronic version of his/her article (indicating the name of the journal and the date of publication) or sends the journal's link where the article can be downloaded. In addition, the name(s) of the supervisor(s) is/are listed.

If the article has been accepted, but not yet published, the journal's note of acceptance needs to be submitted together with the final electronic version of the article.

#### Award:

The winner of the best published PhD article will receive an award of CHF 2'000.-.

# **Evaluation:**

The submission will be evaluated by a panel consisting of experts from national and international academic public health institutions.
