In 2026, the world marks the 40th anniversary of the *Ottawa Charter for Health Promotion* – a milestone document that continues to serve as the global foundation for a holistic approach to health promotion, addressing both social and environmental determinants of health.

To mark this occasion, *Health Promotion and Prevention Working Group* of the Swiss Society of Public Health is hosting a year-long lecture series exploring the development, implementation, and future prospects of the Ottawa Charter in Switzerland.
