Project “Developing a research agenda and suggest appropriate methodologies to investigate the resilience of health systems”

Here is a summary of the project activities.
The project has been implemented as planned. The main outputs of the project are summarized in two manuscripts.

The first one is an analysis manuscript summarizing the findings of and outlining “*A health systems resilience research agenda: moving from concept to practice*” has already been published in BMJ Global Health <https://gh.bmj.com/content/6/8/e006779>. The manuscript summarized the results of a workshop that took place in March 2021.

A second manuscript titled “Re-evaluating our knowledge of health system resilience following COVID-19: Lessons from the pandemic and applied health system resilience research” is still under review in the IJHPM - The submitted version is attached.

In addition, two one complementary outputs have been produced.

First a blog post about the agenda and review was posted on the SYSTAC global website (<https://hive.ahpsr.org/topics/1858/feed>) in January 2022 and the research agenda published in BMJ Global Health was also included on a resource list of papers on resilience for SYSTAC.

Second, another review manuscript titled “Health systems resilience in practice: A scoping review to identify strategies for building resilience” is in advanced stage and will be submitted to a peer reviewed journal in the coming weeks.
