

Science for a
Sustainable Planet



3 prizes will be awared (1 Mio. CHF each)



Who can be nominated?

- Nomination is based on ONE PUBLICATION (published in any journal with peer-review) that fulfills the planet prize criteria
- «accepted» any time since 1.11.2021
- Nominee is ONE co-authoring scientist (the «leading brain» behind the publication (can be any authorship position)

The criteria



The Frontiers Planet Prize wants to honour:



Research that advances insights, approaches, and scalable solutions



Research that has the potential breakthrough applications to reduce or reverse planetary imbalances



Research that explicitly connects several planetary boundaries



Research that explores interaction between multiple planetary boundaries will be prioritized.

Schedule



- a) May 2023: SSPH+ officially registered as «National Nomination Body» (NNB)
- b) June 2023: SSPH+ informs you about the submission details
- c) Sept. 25. 2023 Submission deadline to SSPH+: Sept. 25th 2023
- d) Jury mandated by SSPH+ selects up to 3 candidates
- e) Nov.1 .2023: SSPH+ proposes those candidates to the National Research Body (NRB)
- f) Dec.1.2023: NRB proposes up to 3 national candidates to the «Jury of 100»
- g) Dec 23-Feb 24: "Jury of 100" selects National Champions (one per country) and the 3 prize winners
- h) April 22.24: National Champions announced
- i) June 24 International Champions Award Ceremony at Frontiers Forum
