The successful applicant will be based in Bern, Switzerland at ISPM and lead one or two research groups within the International epidemiology Database to Evaluate AIDS (see <a href="www.iedea-sa.org">www.iedea-sa.org</a>), a large NIH-funded international consortium.

- PhD or equivalent experience in epidemiology, biostatistics or related fields. A medical degree is an asset.
- Experience with clinical and epidemiological studies in the field of infectious diseases and/or cancer, preferably in sub-Saharan Africa or other resource-limited settings.
- Track record of publishing in peer-reviewed scientific journals and writing grant applications.
- Leadership, organizational and communication skills.
- Sensitivity to work in different cultural environments.
- Fluency in English (written and oral); knowledge of German or French is an asset.

## Main tasks:

- Develop, design and lead research projects with de novo data collection and analyses of existing data.
- Write publications in peer-reviewed journals and present results at conferences.
- Support PhD students in manuscript preparation and statistical analyses.
- Write competitive grant applications.
