- **Description** This module provides an introduction to ethics and scientific integrity in health sciences research. Participants will learn about the history and principles of ethics of clinical and public health research, and about issues in the area of scientific integrity such as conflict of interest, authorship, research misconduct. The course further covers selected relevant topics such as the Swiss human research law, research regulation and research ethics committees in Switzerland.
- **Objectives** At the end of the module, participants will have an understanding of the basics and principles of ethics in health research, and they will have gained deeper knowledge in some selected areas.
